PROFESSION OF FAITH

What is the chief end of man?

some to everlasting life, did enter into a covenant of grace, to deliver
them out of the estate of sin and misery, and to bring them into an estate
of salvation by a Redeemer.**

Who is the Redeemer of God's elect?

**The only Redeemer of God's elect, is the Lord Jesus Christ, who, being
the eternal Son of God, became man, and so was, and continueth to be
God and man in two distinct natures, and one person forever.**
